We would like to take this opportunity to express our gratitude to both Zak Wagstaff and Kayleigh Grant who have led the Student Council for two academic years.

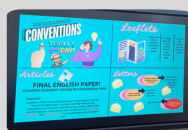


GCSE Breakfast
