#### **Employabilty**

It is our pleasure to announce that the Horticulture department has been given approval to purchase a new greenhouse. This was a complex decision due to the cost and logistics of the request. With the old greenhouse not being cost effective to repair, the Trust decided that the only option was to have a total rebuild. Several quotes were sought to enable a more cost effective approach to the build. A supplier was decided upon, who kindly gave us a discount of £5000 to help us reach our goal.

We are in the process of preparing the date for the build to commence and with the maintenance team this project should soon be on it's way. The new greenhouse will currently support 14 students from learning within the RARPA modules, and the City and Guilds Level 1 and 2 Diplomas and will ensure continual learning for years to come. The new greenhouse will also support our vision for the enterprise project, with the first part being the café.
